

NOTE TO PARENTS

- 1. We acknowledge that the parent is the first and foremost educator. The school welcomes communication, participation, collaboration based on mutual trust and understanding.
- 2. Parents/Guardians should read the rules and regulations of the school before getting their ward admitted.

- 3. No parent or visitor can meet any student during school hours without a written permission of the Principal.
- 4. No act of interference in the school administration will be allowed. However a request or complaint may be made to the Principal.
- 5. Parents/Guardians are earnestly requested to see that their ward attends school regularly and punctually. They are asked to co-operate with the work of the school by enforcing regularity and discipline and by taking a general interest in their ward's progress. They should also see that their ward completes and submits all home assignment on time.
- 6. Parents/Guardians are requested not to send their ward to school if they are suffering from any ailment or infectious diseases until the quarantine period is over.
- 7. Should the need arise for any student to be sent home while classes are still in progress, parents/guardians would need to come and take their ward.
- 8. Parents/Guardians should always attend Parents-Teachers' meetings and whenever they are required by the Principal.
- 9. A school diary is provided to all students and is for official use only. It must be reserved for notices, homework and instructions. It should be brought to school on every working day and produced for inspection whenever required.
- 10. Parents/Guardians are informed that occasional messages from the teachers are conveniently sent through diary and they are encouraged to do likewise. They are also requested therefore to check their ward's diary every day.
- 11. Parents/Guardians should not meet teachers during school hours without the permission of the Principal as the member of the staff cannot leave his/her classroom during teaching period.
- 12. <u>School gates are closed at 8:10 am.</u> Late comers will not be permitted to enter. <u>Parents/Gaurdians who wish to pay fees or meet the Principal may do so from 9:00 am onwards.</u>

Uniform for Class V to Class X:

Girls: Maroon striped full sleeved shirt, brown skirt, school tie, maroon knee length socks with white stripe, maroon ribbon, black clips, CBS sweater and black school shoes with leather straps. Only skin colored leggings are allowed during winter.

Wednesdays- House t-shirt, CBS tracksuit, white ribbon/clips, white knee length socks with maroon stripes and white canvas shoes.

Boys: Maroon striped full sleeved shirt, brown pants, CBS tie, maroon socks with white stripe, CBS sweater and black school shoes with laces.

Wednesdays- House t-shirt, CBS tracksuit, white socks with maroon stripes and white school canvas shoes.

Uniform for Class XI to Class XII:

Girls/Boys: Off-White full sleeved shirt, light khaki pants, CBS Striped tie, CBS grey with stripes sleeveless sweater, royal blue blazer, white socks with blue and black shoes.

Note: Blazer is compulsory for students of classes VIII upwards RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SCHOOL

UNIFORMS

The School uniform is compulsory and students should come to school wearing a neat and correct uniform. The School uniform is to be worn only during school hours or when engaged in official activities. No child is to be seen in uniform in public places after school hours.

Nails should be neatly cut. No coloured nail varnishes are allowed on fingernails or toenails. Girls who have long hair should neatly braid and tie it. Boys should always sport simple and clean haircut. Fancy earrings, finger rings, hair colouring and dyeing are strictly prohibited.

Uniform for Playgroup:

Royal blue 'His Radiance' tracksuit, yellow 'His Radiance' t-shirt, white socks with blue stripes, sneakers (any).

Uniform for KG4 & KG5:

Girls: Maroon striped full sleeved shirt, brown skirt with straps, bowtie, maroon knee length socks with white stripe, maroon ribbon, black clips, CBS sweater and black school shoes with leather straps. Only skin colored leggings are allowed during winter.

Wednesdays- House t-shirt, CBS tracksuit, white ribbon/clips, white knee length socks with maroon stripes and white school canvas shoes.

Boys: Maroon striped full sleeved shirt, brown pants, bowtie, maroon socks with white stripe, CBS sweater and black school shoes with laces.

Wednesdays- House t-shirt, CBS tracksuit, white socks with maroon stripes and white school canvas shoes.

Uniform for Class I to Class IV:

Girls: Maroon striped full sleeved shirt, brown skirt with straps, CBS ready knot tie, maroon knee length socks with white stripe, maroon ribbon, black clips, CBS sweater and black school shoes with leather straps. Only skin colored leggings are allowed during winter.

Wednesdays- House t-shirt, CBS tracksuit, white ribbon/clips, white knee length socks with maroon stripes and white canvas shoes.

Boys: Maroon striped full sleeved shirt, brown pants, CBS ready knot tie, maroon socks with white stripe, CBS sweater and blackk school shoes with laces.

GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

In order to make the students excel in their studies, imbibe in them a sense of responsibility and help them succeed in today's competitive world, discipline is strictly imposed. All students are to strictly abide by the rules and regulations of the school which may be modified from time to time.

- The primary aim of the school is to give its students an education in keeping with the culture and tradition of the country. They are trained to realise their responsibilities and to develop a strong civic sense and spirit that will prepare them for leadership in the society to which they belong. Emphasis is placed on the knowledge and love of God, the formation of a true moral conscience, appreciation of family life and the service of their country.
- Enrolment in the school implies, on the part of the pupil and parents/guardians, willingness to comply with the requirements and regulations of the school.
- A pupil who fails to attain the required standard in different subjects will not be promoted. Reports on general progress will be sent to parents during the year. These should be studied carefully and returned to the school authorities signed by a parent/guardian. The decision of the school authorities with regard to promotion to the next class or selection to sit for the board exams is FINAL.
- 4. No books other than school books, periodicals, pictures or magazines shall be brought into the school without the permission of the Principal. Students should not bring mobile phones, electronic gadgets or any valuable items to school. Any found, will be confiscated and not returned to students or parents/guardians.
- Since it is an English medium school, pupils are expected to speak English during school hours and in the campus.
- Students should be well behaved at all times. They should be polite, obedient and respectful toward their teachers. They should maintain discipline at all times inside the classroom as well as outside.

- 7. Students should attend school punctually and regularly. Any student who is absent from school must produce a leave application from his/her parent/guardian.
- 8. No leave will be granted without the sanction of the Principal. **No half day leave will be granted.**
- 9. In case of absence, the leave application should be sent to the Class teacher the next day through school diary without fail.
- 10. In case of leave exceeding three days on accout of sickness, the application must be accompanied by a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner.
- 11. Leave application not exceeding two days will be considered by the Principal duly forwaded by the Class teacher.
- 12. In case a student remains absent continuously for ten days without leave or informing the school authority, his/her name will be struck off the rolls.
- 13. Application should be written under the signatures of parents/guardians only.
- 14. Only students who have attended 75% of the total working days will be allowed to sit for their final examination.
- 15. Attendance is cumpolsory on non-teaching activity days such as Independence Day, Sports Day, Children's Day, School Week and field/exposure trips. It is compulsory that all children take part in the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for all round development.
- 16. Students are not allowed to leave the school premises during school hours without the Principal's written consent.
- 17. Students should not deface any school furniture, classroom, school building or the campus. Any student found doing so will be asked to pay for the damage done.
- 18. The Principal may ask parents/guardians to withdraw their ward from the institution should the student's conduct, behaviour or influence is detrimental to the interest of other students of the school.

- 19. Should a student be removed from school either by his/her parents/ guardians or the school authority, no Transfer Certificate will be issued until all dues are paid in full.
- 20. No student should have sexual relation in school.
- 21. Smoking or consuming alcohol, tobacco or drugs, sporting of tattoos/body piercing are strictly prohibited.

Any offence will result in immediate expulsion.

NO CONSIDERATION AND NO DISCUSSION

FEES RULES AND REGULATION

- Fees should be paid in cash only to the school office.
- b. Kindly adhere to the fees regulations and fees structure before paying the fees for your child as there will be not refund later on.
- c. Tuition fees must be paid one month in advance, before the 15th of every month.
- d. Annual fees can be paid in two installments-the first within the month of April and the second within the month of September.
- e. A student's name will be struck off the rolls if fees are not paid for a continuous period of two months. Re-admission will not be given.
- f. Fees for November & December should be paid before 15th Nov.
- g. Fees for January & February should be paid before 15th Dec.
- h. An admit card to the Examination will be granted only to a student who has cleared the fees and attended school regularly.
- No deduction is made for the absence of a child during holidays or for broken period. Fees are changed at the end of February of the following year.
- j. A fine of Rs. 50/- will be charged if the receipt is lost.
- k. Any fees once paid is not refundable under any circumstances.
- School management reserves the right to increase the fees without prior notice. However, such a move will be done in the beginning of the academic year.
